Hightower Association News

The Discipleship Committee Teaching and Dinner Meeting on January 10, 2026, at Coal Mountain Baptist Church was well attended. The fellowship hall was almost full. **Jason Power** welcomed everyone to the meeting. **Shad Faulkner** led us in prayer and said the blessing for the delicious meal that we were about to be served by the Boots on the Ground group. The meal consisted of chicken, steak, green beans, baked potatoes, sauteed mushroom, salad, bread, beverages, and a table full of desserts. Everyone enjoyed the meal and fellowship with fellow Christians. **Nancy Vaughan** played hymns on the piano for a few minutes while we ate and fellowshipped with each other.



We sang a few familiar hymns to begin the meeting portion of the evening. **April Pruitt** sang “Jesus, You’re the Center of my Joy”. ***Rev. Tommy Weldy** presented the teaching portion of the meeting using a slide show to talk about the Foundations of the Hightower Baptist Association beginning in 1835 to present day. The Hightower Baptist Association (HBA) was started at Silver Springs Baptist Church that was in the Coal Mountain Community in 1835. He mentioned the missionary controversy between Missionary Baptists who were pro-missions and Primitive Baptists which were “anti-missions” during those years. The churches composing the original membership were Hightower, Little River, Mt. Zion (all in Cherokee County), Island Ford (Gwinnett County), Beaver Ruin (Cumming), Mt. Tabor and Silver Springs (Forsyth), Liberty (Lumpkin then Dawson), and Providence (Cherokee, Milton, Fulton, and Milton again.) These churches in the newly formed association had approximately 500 members at that time. He told about four primary ministers who helped start the Association: **Brothers Richard Phillips**,

Alfred Webb, F M Hawkins, and Humprey Posey who had been a missionary to the Cherokee Indians. The first two foreign missionaries in the Association were **Adoniram Judson and Luther Rice**.

Rev. Weldy also told several other historical events in the Hightower Baptist Association that have happened in the past and some of the things that are going on in the HBA now. Hundreds of people have been saved over the last few years at the HBA Food/Clothing Bank. Now HBA has a Food Trailer that they can carry into the Mission Field. (It was at the meeting for people to look at). The new Hispanic Church on the Post Road was recently established. Boots on the Ground mission became a part of the Hightower Food/Clothing Bank over the last year. Rev. Weldy ended his presentation with “Go Tell!” Tell what you’ve seen. Tell what God’s done for you. I know whose I am. We all need Jesus. He told about the next **Discipleship Meeting/Training will be Friendship Baptist Church on March 14, 2026**.



Rev. Butch Kirk spoke for a few minutes talking about the mission God has called him to do. He told his experience of grace.

Rev. Dan Henderson and Rev. Vernie Worley were there when he was saved and Rev. Henderson showed him how to go.

Rev. Andy Wallace spoke saying that we have stories that need to be told. He told how he got started with Boots on the Ground fourteen months ago. “God wants YOU!” Andy then told stories of Moses and of Peter and Andrew being called by Jesus to be “fishers of men”.

A few announcements were made. The meeting was closed with the group singing “Amazing Grace”. **Rev. Gary English** led us in prayer. An offering was taken at the door for those who would like to donate to this mission group.

Boots on the Ground Report from Kim Weldy

The Lord is still in charge in 2026! We are so thankful for the new faces that have joined our group. In this last year, God has truly blessed us. Thank you, Jesus, for the growth and people who are willing to serve you.

We continue to try to support whatever needs arise! There have been many, especially with the weather so cold the last couple of weeks. We have many families that we are working with and continue to serve them as the Lord leads us. God has blessed us and allowed us to provide washers and dryers, stoves, furniture, home remodels, bathroom remodels, cars, car repairs, food, and the list goes on and on. Most of all, he has provided us opportunities to tell people about our Jesus! We have been blessed with opportunities to serve the homeless in Forsyth, Dawson, and Hall counties. Food, blankets, sleeping bags, gas heaters, tents, clothes, and more have been provided for those we serve. We desire them all to get cleaned up, get a job, and improve upon their circumstances.

On Sunday, December 7th, we were able to handout toys at Main Street Park in Dawsonville. Many families came to receive toys for Christmas. Thank you to the Hightower Foodbank for partnering with us in this endeavor.

We have teamed up with **Pastor Jerry** in Hall County. Pastor Jerry helps run a homeless camp. For this next year, Boots will serve at the camp every 5th Saturday of every month. We will serve food, provide necessities and clothes, and oversee the service. Our first encounter will be Saturday, Jan. 31st. Anyone interested in joining us, should meet at our Boots Building by 3:30pm. We are located at 63 Daisy Dr. Dawsonville. We are looking forward to worshipping with these that God has sent to us.

Thankfully, God sent Alpha Hope Counseling, to partner with us to provide Christian counseling to many of our families. Many of them have been through trauma and hardships many cannot comprehend. Christian counseling is providing them Godly guidance in maneuvering through the emotional trauma.



We held our very **first Discipleship Training on January 10, 2026, at Coal Mountain Baptist Church**. Thank you for all those that attended. What a blessing! Fergusons provided a delicious meal, and desserts were provided by many supporting churches. **Tommy Weldy** gave all the details on the history and foundation of the Hightower Association. By giving us the knowledge and understanding of the origin of the association, we were encouraged to remain on the path God has created for us. **Andy Wallace, Butch Kirk, and Jason Power** gave an update on the work that the Lord has been leading our Boots group to do.

Hopefully we will continue to share the love of Jesus by loving and helping those around us. **The next training will be March 14th at 6pm at Friendship Baptist Church**. Ava Gilbert, Missionary to Japan for Deaflympics

Ava Gilbert, daughter of Scott and Kendra Gilbert, was invited to the New Harmony Baptist Church WMU Meeting to share stories from her 2-week mission trip to Japan for the Deaflympic Games in November 2025. I loved the excitement that Ava had while telling us about her trip. At the Deaflympics she would look around everywhere and join in conversations with those she saw “signing”. This led to some very special relationships that are continuing even now.



There are 70-80 million culturally Deaf people globally. This means that they cannot hear and use some form of sign language as their primary form of communication, 98% of these people do not know Jesus. The Deaf are classified as UUPG (Unreached and unengaged People Group) primarily due to the fact that they lack access to Bibles in their sign language. There are over 300 different sign languages. The United States has the only complete Bible for the deaf. The DeafBible App has the whole Bible translated into American Sign Language on video.



not in her language she was overwhelmed with the power of the gospel and surrendered her life to Christ that day.



This was the first time that the International Mission Board worked in Deaflympics. There are 70-80 countries that participate in the Deaflympics and over seven thousand Deaf people in attendance. Ava showed us her gospel story pin that she was wearing and that she used to tell the story about Jesus. The IMB gave out cards with the same logo and a QR code to use as they told others about Jesus. Each part of the pin was used to tell people about Jesus: **Orange**- God's perfection and holiness, **Yellow**- God's Creation, **Black**- sin and man's separation from God, **Red**- Jesus' sacrifice on the cross, **Blue**- the opportunity to ask Jesus for forgiveness and be in relationship with Him, **Green**- the Holy Spirit that begins to transform us so that we can be a light for Jesus, **White**- the church as a community of believers who belong to God, **Yellow**- the gift of eternal life with Jesus in Heaven, this brings us back to **Orange**- where we are in relationship with God the way He originally designed it to be.

Ava's Dad has always told her that mission trips start when you leave your house. Ava heeded this and witnessed at the US airport to a cyclist in the Deaflympics who invited her to come see his competition. Even though the competition was 3 hours south of Tokyo, while Ava was trying to figure out how she could get funds to go the extra miles, the IMB came through to pay for her trip to see him compete and win the Gold Medal in Cycling. (We know that Georgia Baptist Mission Board gave \$500,000 to the IMB at the Convention on November 11 so maybe we helped her get to that competition.) She is still hearing from these people since they have come home. Ava told us that one night on a short walk to dinner God brought about two different conversations and opportunities to share the gospel with Deaf Americans and Deaf Japanese people leading to 7 people seeing the Good News that night.



Ava also signed the Lord's Prayer for us at New Harmony. She said it took her about 4-5 years to become fluent in American Sign Language, while this trip exposed her to International Sign Language which is more gesture based. Additionally, God provided divine language acquisition for Ava as she engaged in various gospel conversations that included roughly five other sign languages she did not know before the trip.

Ava was happy to report that there were 13 people who received salvation, 245 people interested in the Gospel, 1 person was baptized, and 4,000 QR

codes (on back of card above) were given out. The IMB did not just hand out cards, they talked to people. Other religions were there witnessing to the Deaf people and giving out their resources; however, that did not discourage the volunteers from sharing the Good News with everyone they could. She encourages the Baptists to go out and tell the Deaf about Jesus. **Eula Jean Campbell** commented that she would like to have more people “sign” in our churches. Ava has asked the Hightower Association to begin to include the international Deaf population in their prayers for missionaries abroad and to pray for the International Mission Board’s Deaf Affinity as they work to reach Deaf around the globe.

Friendship Baptist Church has been awarded a Pomeroy Foundation Marker for their cemetery in memory of John N LeGrand who was a member of the church from 1841-1843. Mr. LeGrand is the only Forsyth County American Revolutionary War Patriot who is buried in Forsyth County according to the research that the Chestatee River Daughter of the American Revolution have found. **A ceremony for this event is planned for May 30.** More details will be given later. There are only 250 Historical Markers being placed across the nation for our country's 250th Anniversary this year by Pomeroy Foundation. Mr. LeGrand is actually buried on Watson Property on Watson Road as there was probably not a cemetery at Friendship when he passed in 1843.

1. The **January Food/Clothing Bank Distribution** was a slower day on this rainy Saturday morning. Thanks to all the volunteers, especially the Service baseball teams that have been so faithful this fall and winter with help. Linda and I would like to praise the Lord for the great quantity of baby diapers and wipes donated last month! It is a wonderful feeling when we can tell Paul, Angie and Kevin, "It looks like we won't need to order diapers or wipes this month due to the donations this month." We would like to encourage our member Churches and their small groups and VBS groups to consider as a service to our Lord and Savior, supporting the Baby Goods ministry of our Hightower Baptist Association's Food and Clothing Bank.
2. I encourage our Churches to be in prayerful considerations of going on a **short-term mission trip this summer**. 

The Seven Realities of Experiencing God

1. God is always at work around you.
2. God pursues a continuing love relationship with you that is real and personal.
3. God invites you to become involved with Him in His work.
4. God speaks by the Holy Spirit through the Bible, prayer, circumstances, and the church to reveal Himself, His purposes, and His ways.
5. God’s invitation for you to work with Him always leads you to a crisis of belief that requires faith and action.
6. You must make major adjustments in your life to join God in what He is doing.
7. You come to know God by experience as you obey Him, and He accomplishes His work through you.
