

God Bless and Guide us during the Summer 2025 to lift the Name of Jesus!!

It is Summer! Vacation Bible School and Summer Revival time for the Hightower Baptist Churches in our Association. Most of the announcements in this volume are about when these services will be held. Please be in prayer for all these services and a Great Revival in our Churches and Communities. It is also the time that students and families are out of school (college) and can take some mission trips to help spread the Gospel throughout the world. Please pray for all our missionaries out there proclaiming Jesus Christ to this world. Below is a Mission Story from this past spring.



Friendship Baptist Church sponsored one of its members, **Joseph Vandergrift**, on a mission trip to the Dominican Republic, March 15-21, 2025. The group of approximately 100 members, comprised of young adults from various fraternities and sororities at **Georgia Southern University (GSU)**, participated in the mission trip. The group, working through **Filter of Hope**, provided clean drinking water and the gospel to local families. The group partnered with local church leadership and went out into rural communities of the Dominican Republic to install water filters into a 5-gallon bucket at the homes of local families. Each water filter installed would provide up to 250-gallons of clean drinking water each day and would last for 10 years with a once daily cleaning of the filter. The group also shared their individual testimonies with the families and gave each family a Spanish translation copy of the New Testament. At the end of the week, the group had installed a total 430 water filters, 795 people had heard

the gospel, and 133 people prayed and received Christ as their Savior. (Editor note: Sounds like many received the Living Water that Jesus provides because of these college students' work.)

Can you identify this church which is in the Hightower Association? (The information came from *The Men and Missions of Hightower Volume 2: Churches.*)




Here are a few hints:

- Organized in 1832 and helped form the Hightower Association in 1835.
- First Pastor: Elder Solomon Peak
- In 3rd District of HBA
- Church was built in community that was part of the Cherokee Indian Territory
- Present church building was built around the second church building which was built in 1882.

I would like to share a **little history from the Hightower Association Meetings from the 1950's.**

Please read this and then look at the numbers from the new minutes of the Hightower Association which have just been released. What do you think?



This is a portion of the **Report on Evangelism from the 1954 HBA meeting** (70 years ago).

"To evangelize is to preach or teach the gospel to lost men and women, boys and girls, in order that they may become not only professed Christians but may live it in their lives. We are given in the New Testament the writing of the four evangelists, Matthew, Mark, Luke and John, for the purpose of Using it to lead souls to Christ. The ultimate aim is to urge on Christians the responsibility of becoming everbearing spiritually. In the last year, Hightower Association containing 16,388 members won only 411 souls to Christ or one soul for every 40 members.

This year with 16,799 members, we have won 542

souls to Christ of one soul for every 31 members. We should do better than that. Why not urge each Church to hold at least two revivals instead of just one and give our young ministers a job of helping to run these revivals. Our young people would enjoy the art of soul winning once they have got into it and we recommend that each Church find something for its members to do in the interest of furthering the Kingdom of our Lord and his Gospel being indoctrinated, in the minds during the formative period.

We urge that the various Churches throughout the Association cooperate with other Churches and set the time which best suits their needs to do the evangelistic work for their Church. Invite some of the best talent as laborers from other places to help you enlist the many idle Church Members so that in evangelizing their joy may be increased and souls saved for the Great Cause. This is one of the most important parts of the Program and it should be emphasized in the minds of our lay members as well as ministers. Timidity, lack of studying God's Word and place assignment by encouragement is keeping many people out of the Spiritual field, though the field is already white unto harvest. The grain needs to be reaped and there is always some one to do it if we and they will only realize it, pray, cooperate and carry out the Lord's design in us, his children. When Christ was about to leave the world, He left a

commission for us to follow and we recommend that we follow it as directed in Acts 1:8 and the other evangelist...There are literally hundreds of souls hungering for the good news of salvation to satisfy their souls desire which can be done by us if we will." (Committee: W H Flanagan, H T Padgett, Winford Burruss) Report was adopted.

In the **1957 edition of the HBA** minutes, the committee was called **Christian Growth and Progress of the Church** (I think as there was not a report called Evangelism).

"First, to be a Christian we must be born again by Grace through our faith in the Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. Next, to grow as a Christian we must pattern our growth after Christ and Luke tells us No. 3:52, 'and Jesus increased in wisdom and stature and in favor with God and man.'

We should have a desire to study God's word and learn more about His will. Paul said to study to show thyself approved, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed. But we must also grow spiritually. The Bible tells us that the letter killeth but the spirit maketh alive. Our Christian labors must also please God and be according to His will and not the will of man. And last, we must gain the confidence of men in order to be able to lead lost souls to Christ.

We are happy, also to report a great growth of the literal church in 1957. The churches of the Hightower Association added 558 new members to the church by Baptism this year which is 20% increase over 1955. The Christian church, which began to grow at Pentecost, is still growing and now claims more members than any other group or religion on earth." (Committee: Rev. Hugh Fields, Rev. H B Haygood, Rev. Broughton Bottoms. The report was discussed and adopted.)


Hightower Association WMU News
Hightower Baptist Association WMU Spring Event

The HBA WMU Spring Meeting looked different this year as we met at the Hightower Association Food and Clothing Bank instead of at a host church on April 28, 2025. **Leigh Hawkins**, HBA WMU Director, welcomed everyone. **Kevin Smith** also welcomed everyone to his "second" home, the Food and Clothing Bank. **Stacey Gonzales**, Assistant HBA WMU Director, recognized the pastors and their wives who were attending and informed the group that a donation in honor of the pastors and their wives will be donated to the newly formed Boots on the Ground mission group of the HBA. **JoAnne Burruss**, Prayer Coordinator of HBA WMU, told us of the Missionary Prayer Requests from the Mission Board. **Peggy Pruitt**, Treasurer of HBA WMU, led the prayer for Missionaries.



Our Missionary Speaker was **Jason Power** (**Kim Weldy** was unable to attend). Jason told how “Boots on the Ground” Mission Group started. In October 2024, someone got a call to help collect coats for Hurricane Helene victims in Boone, NC. Cold temperatures were coming and these folks had no coats. The word got out and the very next morning a load of coats were on their way to NC. Later loads of clothes, Christmas toys for children and many supplies were carried. I think the HBA truck was taking supplies a few times each week and continues to carry supplies.

A group of 15 to 25 people met regularly at **Andy Wallace**’s home to pray and plan for these trips. The Samaritan woman at the well scripture was told. Boots on the Ground is also in Dawson County. **Scott Sorrells** spoke about a small home having electrical problems. Goshen and Bethel got together 25 volunteers who went to the home to clean up and put in new wiring. We were told that **Butch Kirk** goes every Saturday and Sunday to serve food in North Carolina. Now you may give donations to the Hightower Association Food and Clothing Bank to the Boots on the Ground mission. Just write “Boots on the Ground” in Memo section of your check to Hightower Food/Clothing Bank. Also, you can see pictures of some of the many things that HBA and others are doing for these storm victims in Western North Carolina.)



Paul Bagley told more stories. A building was built in Lansing, NC. Paul mentioned that a closing down boot company had donated 400 pairs of boots to the F/C Bank. These books were in a storage room at the bank. He took these boots to NC where they were needed. 200 families needed Bibles. An anonymous donor gave \$25,000 to buy Bibles. Those families received Bibles.

Announcements were then made and the meeting closed. **Rev. Travis Bridgeman** led the group to sing “It is Well with my Soul” acapella. It was beautiful. Then a prayer and blessing was asked before we enjoyed refreshments of sandwiches, cake, cookies, fresh fruit and vegetables, salmon ball and water while the group fellowshiped. It was a lovely evening in a portion of the Hightower Baptist Association Food and Clothing Bank.

Georgia Baptist Women Spring Event 2025



The Spring Event this year was held at Abilene Baptist Church in Martinez, Georgia on April 25-26, 2025. The event started with a mission project. The early arrival ladies packed 1000 care bags with fast food gift cards, gums, mints, hand sanitizer and such, a handwritten card and a gospel tract specific for first responders telling about how God is our ultimate hero. 300 of the bags were to be taken to Pinnacle Retreat Center and be given out to EMTs attending a

mandatory training event. The 600+ ladies attending the conference were asked to take a packed bag to someone in their own community. Ducktown Fire Department received the two bags from **Janice Tallant and Leigh Hawkins**. **Teresa Singleton** also attended the Spring Event and is alternate on the Nominating Committee for Northwest Region.

At the Friday night Missions Celebration, the guest speaker was **Catherine Renfro**, the National Director of Women’s Evangelism at the North American Mission Board. Catherine (wife of Chris Renfro, Pastor of Hope Church in Alpharetta, GA) spoke about “Seek Jesus, See Jesus, Share Jesus” and encouraged ladies to share their faith and live on mission in their daily lives. (Editor note: a prayer was led during the service for the First Responders/EMTs who would receive the gift bags. While Catherine was speaking, an overhead spotlight burst and broken glass fell on a lady sitting on our row of tables. While people were helping the lady and calling 911, we immediately went into prayer for the lady. The meeting was closed and the First Responders arrived as we were leaving. The lady was at the meeting on Saturday. She was fine. She had received 5 stitches from her injury. I felt like this was an unusual accident. I had written on my cards to the EMTs “thank you for helping people in some very unusual situations”. I think this was one of those times.)

On Saturday, we had two Worship Sessions and two Breakout Sessions. **Elizabeth Woodson** was the Worship Session speaker. She read scripture from Joshua 1:1-2 and Deuteronomy 34:8. She said to process pain, stay focused on the goal. In the afternoon session she talked about Joshua 1:3. She spoke of three false thoughts and the truth of these. We might think:

1. God is not trustworthy, but the truth is **God is sovereign**. He is all powerful and knows what is best. (Genesis 1:1)
2. God does not care, but the truth is **God's love began for us before we were born**. (Exodus 34:6). The God of the Old Testament and the New Testament is the same. God's love persists for us.
3. God has abandoned us. (Matthew 6:33, Matthew 11:23, 2 Corinthians 9:8). **If my God says He is going to show up, we should wait expectantly**. Be confident and calm because you know God will do what He said He would do.

There were 8 Breakout Sessions to choose from. The first session I attended was a missionary from Dhaka, Bangladesh who talked about a mission with young girls. Dhaka is the most densely populated city in the world and is 91% Islam, 8 % Hindu, <1 % Christians. Pray for these missionaries working here. My second session was with **Gayla Parker** who talked about Proverbs 31 and a woman of VALOR. V is for Value. A is Attentive to our heart of how God created us. L is Love unconditionally. R is Reflect the image of God. It was a wonderful event.




This picture was at the VBS Clinic at Longstreet.
